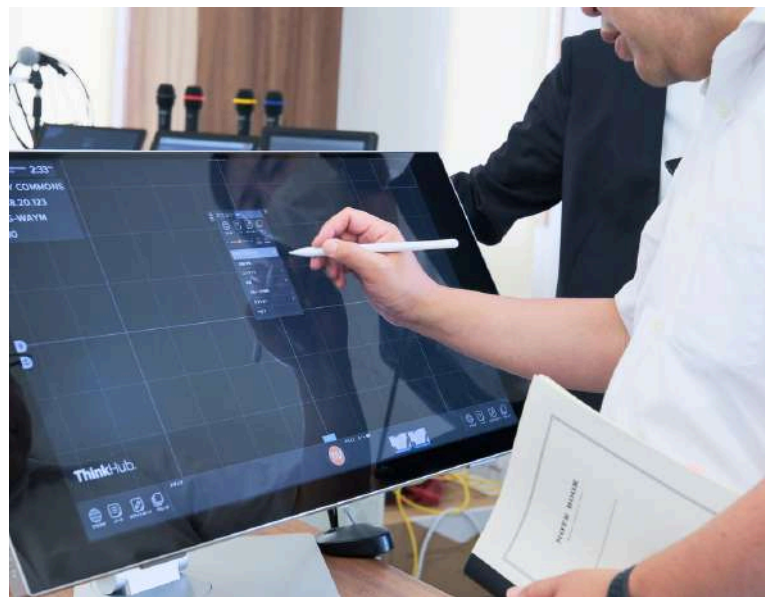

With the introduction of Trinity Hall, NDSU aimed to create a state-of-the-art learning environment that fosters collaboration, creativity, and interactive learning.

Trinity Hall's vision was to develop a space that supports dynamic and flexible learning activities — to integrate a solution that could facilitate seamless collaboration, interactive presentations, and a more engaging educational experience. NDSU turned to ThinkHub to create an innovative learning space that set a new standard for interactive and engaging education, preparing students for the collaborative demands of the modern world.

BACKGROUND

Notre Dame Seishin University is a private women's university based in Okayama, Japan. The year 2024 marks the 100th anniversary of the arrival of six sisters from the United States of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, the university's founding organization, in Okayama. To commemorate the 100th anniversary of the sisters' arrival in Japan, two new faculties were opened this spring and a new academic building, Trinity Hall, was completed.

"Trinity" means three persons in one in Japanese, and here it expresses "true unity, close fellowship, and deep joy." With this blessing from God, "Trinity Hall" was newly built as a seven-story learning facility with the hope that it will become a place of interaction and study for a diverse range of people (students, faculty, researchers, etc. from Japan and abroad).

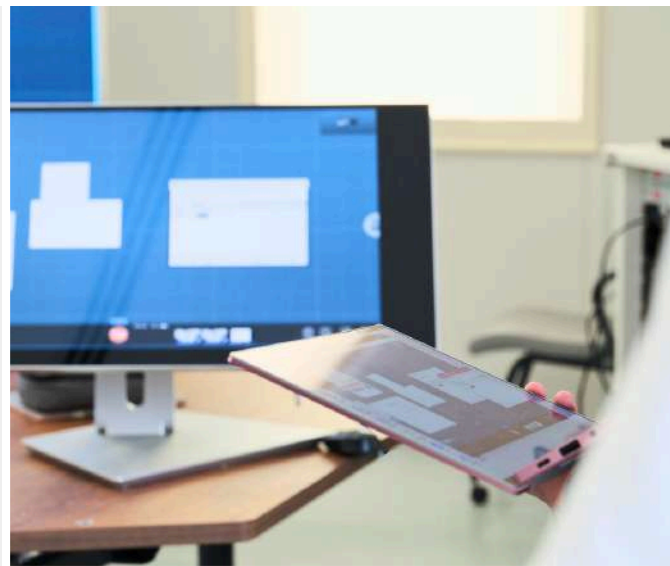
I hope that students will have lots of fun using ThinkHub and find their own unique ways to use it as part of their learning.
